

Seedfolks

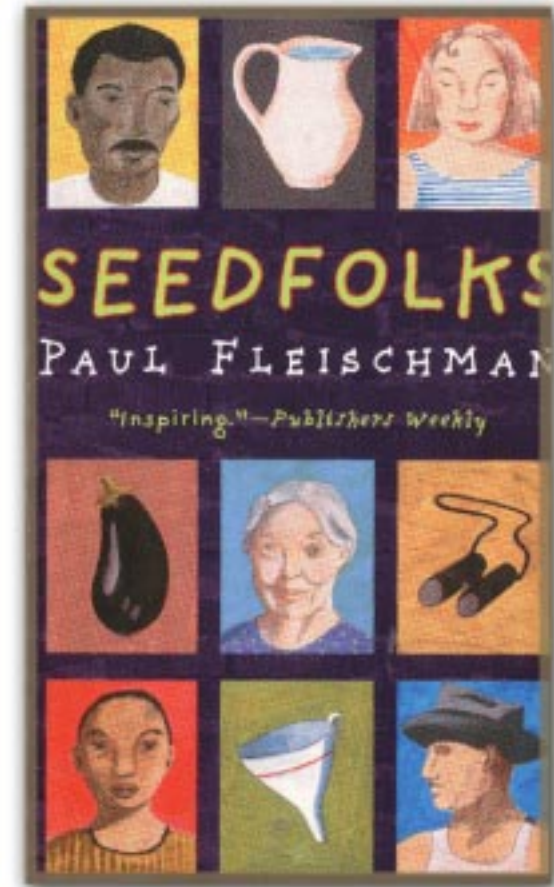
