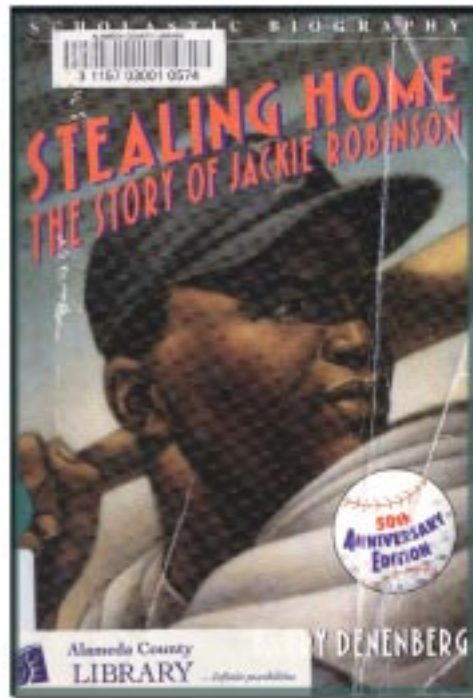


Stealing Home: the Story of Jackie Robinson
